ATTACK OF THE CLONES: INTRODUCTION OF THE WILLOW SAWFLY IN AUSTRALIA

- ➡ Willows (Salix spp.) are among the worst environmental weeds in Australia, with important consequences for aquatic and terrestrial environments. Nematus oligospilus Förster (Hymenoptera: Tenthredinidae), the willow sawfly, has been introduced inadvertently into most regions of the Southern Hemisphere, where it established and quickly became invasive partly due to its ability to reproduce clonally.
- At high population densities, *N. oligospilus* larvae can cause extensive willow defoliation and even lead to tree death. Could it be a free biological control agent for willows in Australia?
- ♣ This presentation will focus on the ecology and evolution of *N. oligospilus* in its introduced range to understand the reasons behind its persistence, spread and potential long-term impacts.
